Water is Life



A single grain contains the weight of the universe and a single drop of water, the life. Although everyone is aware of the importance of 'water', those who have not experience thirst may consider it as a story in a faraway country they only see in the media rather than an issue that affects them. There is a countless number of people suffering from the small rainfall in the distant continent of Africa, thereby resulting in lack of available water. However, are you also aware that people at the Lake Tonlesap, the largest lake in Asia, in Cambodia with abundance of rainfall are also suffering due to the lack of water? Lake Tonlesap is the key source of potable water for the Cambodians and the site of livelihood of more than 2 million people. With such a large number of people living at homes by the lakeside as well as on the water, various pollutants including the secretions from livestock and waste and discarded water by people flow into the Lake without being filtered, and seriously pollute the Lake. Moreover, there is

inadequate infrastructure for the management of water and it is the reality that the existing facilities are too poor to prevent and manage the pollution of water. Accordingly, people consistently experience absolute lack of safe water to drink and suffer from many water-borne diseases including various deformities, gastritis and skin diseases arising from water pollution.

In order to secure clean potable water, people have to travel to water wells situated at a substantial distances. As it is not possible to carry large quantity of water that they need in a single trip, they have to spend a lot of time to make numerous trips to the well every day. Dail Community is executing Mulfor (project for the support of provision of clean and drinkable water) in order for a larger number of people to drink and wash with clean water to their hearts content. We would like to introduce the sites of Dail Mulfor at which the springs of hope are surging up.

Water accounts for 70% of our body and clean water needs to be consumed in order to maintain good health of the body. However, the people of Cambodia are drinking polluted rather than clean water because of the excessive contents of lime and iron in the water. Many of the people in Cambodia use rain water collected in pots or water gathered in the pot holes dug in the ground around their residences with shovel for daily use including consumption. Such water easily becomes the habitat for mosquitoes and various parasites that will induce infection to water-borne diseases including diarrhea, typhoid fever and cholera as well as various complications

through the virus found in the polluted water if consumed continuously. Majority of the regions of Cambodia lacks water supply network with only 40% of the residents in Phnom Penh, the capital city, 50% of residents in Sihanoukville and 15% of people in the farming regions are receiving tap water through water pipe network.

The areas around the Siem Reap Center where Cambodia Dail Community is situated have absolutely no water supply facility. Accordingly, people use water pumped out from the depth of the ground. However, it is not possible to obtain completely clean water in this manner. We need several hundred liters of water every day just to cook rice and bake bread for approximately 500 people every day. Purchasing clean potable water every day for use in cooking rice, washing and cooking food items as well as drinking to ensure the health of the children has been very burdensome.

Execution of MOU with the 'Scientists and Engineers without Borders'

'Scientists and Engineers without Borders' upon











hearing the news of the situation in Siem Reap offered their assistance. 'Scientists and Engineers without Borders' is an organization of scientists and engineers that provides technologies appropriate for the countries with difficulties regardless of the national boundaries. This appropriate technology refers to those that can be used easily at reasonable price by the poor and alienated neighbors rather than the expensive and complicated new technologies that are enjoyed by less than 10% of people in the world.

The 'Scientists and Engineers without Borders' installed water purification and treatment system at the Cambodia Dail Community, which produces clean water from the polluted water by means of the 4-staged filtering system in addition to the preliminary processing with environment-friendly filter, Bio Sand Filter (BSF), that uses sand and pebbles. Furthermore, the 'Scientists and Engineers without Borders' enabled much larger number of people to drink water with peace of mind by expanding the water purification facility that resulted in safe and clean water through meticulous water quality test through the execution of MOU with the Dail Welfare Foundation. Thanks to their generous contribution, we are able to stably supply clean water to many

people now. In addition, they pledged to continuously supply filters and perform water quality tests in the future.

Tasty water!

When we told the local staffs that we will be purifying the water from the water pump at the Center, they became guizzical at the concept. However, after the 'Scientists and Engineers without Borders' who installed the water purification system drank the water produced followed by the Korean staffs as well as the presentation of the results of water purification, the local staffs also tasted the water and are praised the taste of the water. As we are now able to continuously drink tasteful and clean water, children who visit the Center began to bring water bottle when they visit the Center. Previously, children were only able to have meals and drink water in the water bottle at Babfor without being able to take water home. Now, they can drink and even take home as much water as they want. Furthermore, we began execution of 'Mulfor', a project for sharing of clean water for free, for an hour every day at the designated time for the residents with financial difficulties who visit the Center by giving out 2,000 liters of water collected and stored through the water purification system throughout the day.

It is the mindset of all the staffs serving at the Dail Community to unsparingly share the highest quality goods with the children who have to walk substantial distance every day to have a meal. We are so grateful and happy that clean water can be provided to the children and warm smiles of contentment of fathers appear on our faces as we watch the children drinking water with peace of mind. We sincerely hope that they will grow in even better health by continuously sharing clean and safe water with the children.

Grace Trio held concert in commemoration of its establishment at the Taean Culture & Arts Center on October 24 last year. This concert was dedicated to the children in Tanzania, Africa who are living their daily lives with great deal of difficulties. I met Grace Trio who are actively pursuing a diverse range of musical activities not only for the children in Tanzania barely sustaining their lives on daily basis but also for the purpose of cultivation of emotional stability of the children and adolescents in the local society as well as the long-term advancement of culture and arts in the local society in the 21st century.

>>> Please tell us about Grace Trio.

It is a Trio Ensemble formed to participate in the grace of the Lord that flows like river. We simply perform music energetically if we can assist our neighbors in the local society and throughout the world, console those who are suffering through beautiful music in order to infuse peace in their hearts with the small talent that God has

granted us. Grace Trio is composed of 3 musicians like the archangels Michael, Gabriel and Raphael. The pianist is a person currently working as the senior accompanist at the Pyeongtaek Hapjeong Baptist Church who is overflowing with love and the violist is a highly competent musician who graduated from the College of Music of Chungang University at the top of the class with major in contemporary music and is full of love and passion while the cellist is an artist with heart as kind as an angel who is currently enrolled in the graduate school of Ewha Women's University.

>>> What has prompted you to form Grace Trio?

We have been in charge of special songs at the local unified services during our school years and wanted to establish opportunities to present gracious stages with the talents that God has given us. In spite of the busy schedules of having to execute our professional works and childcare at home, we decided to form the Trio in order to offer meaningful concerts by assisting the less fortunate neighbors through the beautiful harmony 3 of us create.

>>> What would be the most meaningful moment you had while holding numerous concerts?

Although we had to prepare the concerts through prolonged practices and prayers to cope with the enormity of the tasks at hand, our fear grew as we found great deal of inadequacies in use along with numerous concerns as we are only human. We were grateful for the process of resolving many of our difficulties with better things and methods whenever we encountered them, and our hearts filled up with joy by the interests and love that many people around us has given.

>>> What is the reason for using all the profits of the concerts to help the less fortunate neighbors?

We always felt sorry whenever we watched our children who are growing up under abundant environment in comparison to the children confronted with a lot of ordeals without parents or under extremely poor environment throughout the world. We are donating the profits generated in order to convey the message that they were also born to be loved through the interest and sponsorship we provide.

>>> Are there any particular reasons for sponsoring the Dail Community?

Hyeon Shin Lee, an assistant director, who I respect and love so much, has been dispatched to Tanzania by the Dail Community and ardently pursuing the tasks given. As we watched the children who were breaking up rocks at the stone quarry resolving their hunger by visiting the Tanzania Dail Community Center and advancing into the schools through the mission works of Chang Jae Byeon, the director, and Hyeon Shin Lee, the assistant director, we decided to sponsor Dail Community in encouragement of their enormous dedications and love by offering our hearts and efforts.

>>> Please tell us about the sharing plans of Grace Trio in the future.

Frankly, those living in the current era have no mental or economic leisure to pay attention to the lives of those around us. However, Grace Trio will willingly go anywhere to console the heartaches of our neighbors by gathering of beautiful hearts just as the streams gather to form rivers which in turn are directed to the wide ocean by performing beautiful music and sharing love.

Cha Sool Lee, a 'Babfor' volunteer who had been a homeless person in the past, would not tell anyone how he had lived in the past.

He drank agricultural chemical as an attempt at suicide. He was only 12 years old at the time but the rough life had taken all the courage to live from the young boy. He felt his future is extremely gloomy with no way out of the misery he was in. Although his peers were living under the warm and loving care of their parents, he chose death. But life was very tenacious. An adult who was passing by found the life gradually draining out of the boy with white foam surging out of the mouth at a corner in the back alley. The passerby put the boy on his back and ran to the nearby hospital. When he woke up, he was lying on a hospital bed. He fell into even deeper despair in having failed to end his life.... His father was jailed for having killed someone and his mother ran away by abandoning young brothers without being able to overcome the hardship of life. He felt that he was thoroughly deserted by all those around him. He lived his life with the attitude of 'I don't give a damn!' He lived the life of a vagrant and homeless person. His resident registration was also obliterated 30 years ago as he expected nothing from the government and the society. The highly deprived boy is now providing voluntary service of assisting the less fortunate neighbors with white beard on his face. Mr. Lee (58-Photograph) who had been abandoned by death and lived all his life as a homeless person begins his day by picking up garbage and sweeping the streets of his neighbor at early hours of the morning nowadays.

Father is jailed and mother ran away from home / Survived his attempt at suicide at the age of 12 by drinking agricultural drug / Lived as a vagrant on the street all his life by turning his back on the world / Forged relationship with the Dail Community from which he received free meals / Lived in flop house for 10 years through the introduction by Pastor Ildo Choi / Operates as a street vendor after having been baptized and is participating in voluntary services of 'free meal distribution'

Mr. Lee has been living at the back of the Cheongnyangni Station where district of restricted access for adolescents still exists. He picked wastes for living and frequently engaging in fist fights in the neighborhood since his 20's. The area was swarming with prostitutes and beggars from all corners of the country. The first interview held on the 4th last month ended only in 3 minutes because he burst into tears that he held back all his life as he reminisced with his childhood life. "I can't talk anymore. My past is so painful and I just want to forget it." It was not possible to stop him as he turned his back with sobering shoulders. It seemed that just recalling his particularly perilous past imparted enormous pain onto him. There was not a single healthy tooth to be found in his highly wrinkled face that made him appear 10 years older than he actually is.



Majority of his friends who lived on the streets with him during his younger years has already passed away. They froze to death during bitter cold winters and died easily even by common cold due to their weakened immunity. They were mostly very lazy. Although Mr. Lee had innately weak physical dispositions, he was relatively diligent and did not fall a victim of diseases. It was the time of withstanding the bitter cold of winter in a deserted house without roof for which demolition was ceased temporarily. In spite of his relatively good health, he confronted the risk of ending his life of deep resentment in October last year. He had to undergo major surgery due to the distention of the blood vessels in his brain at the cost of approximately US\$ 10,000. Accordingly, he revived his resident registration that had been cancelled some 30 years ago because he was in need of the subsidy by the Seoul Metropolitan City government. Even though the hospital anticipated that Mr. Lee's chance of regaining health was very slim, there had not been any after effect since the surgery. He has been living in a flop house that 'Babfor' Pastor, Ildo Choi, had introduced for him 10 years ago. Prior to that, he lived 17 years of his life as a homeless person. Pastor Ildo Choi who he met on the street is the benefactor who took care of him for the last 27 years.

He not only cleans the areas around his residence but also his entire neighborhood and participates in voluntary service for free meal distribution at the Dail Community. Mr. Lee who Pastor Choi met when the Pastor began his services of providing free meals to the homeless people at Cheongnyangni by cooking instant noodle was treated as an older brother by Pastor Choi until last year because he looked much older. With the educational background of having attended the evening classes of middle school, Mr. Cha Sool Lee who lived the life

of a homeless during his youth and now serving in the 'Babfor' never told anyone how had had lived his life. He was just referred to as the 'Manwoo Grandpa'. No one knew of his real name and even used false name when he was baptized last year.

Nowadays, he operates as a street vendor in the vicinity of the Cheongnyangni Station after having completed his voluntary services at the Dail Community in the morning. He sells shoes and garments at prices lower than the wholesalers. Although his earnings are not significant, he is excited at the prospect of earning money even if small. He also has a 'girl friend' who is the only person he felt love for although she is now in a care home due to the ailing body. They met while receiving free meals at Babfor and have been living by relying on each other and sharing affection even though she is older than Mr. Lee. His girlfriend received supplementary living allowance by the government as she had

valid resident registration and used it for the less fortunate neighbors. Mr. Lee received his newly issued resident registration card in the morning of the 7th. Although he had been living his life as a person without registered domicile with the sense of betrayer and abandonment by the society thus far, it is different now. He has been recognized as a respectable citizen of Seoul in 30 years. "I lived my life without resident registration until now because I wanted to live quietly and die without exercising any rights and without any responsibilities to the country."

He is now registered as a welfare recipient for the basic living allowances from the government. "It is not my money and I would like to use it to help the children like me with difficulties in receiving proper education. I also have to make tithe to the Church." Mr. Lee, who is reborn as "Cha Sool Lee" from his previous status as 'Manwoo Grandpa' smiled brightly.





The Christian culture was still not comfortable to me since I began to believe in Jesus over the age of 20. During my consultation with a professor who I respected, I was recommended to "participate in the 'Finding Beautiful World." Although I was hesitant because I was still not familiar with the Christian culture, I said yes when hearing that the 1st Stage can be participated not only by the Christians but also by non-Christians. Although I had to go from Changwon in Gyeongnam, the professor picked me up at Daegu and took me to the Seolgok Mountain. On my way to the Seolgok Mt. in the car the professor drove, I wondered 'What could possibly be in the Seokgok Mt. to induce such assertive attitude from the professor?'

Finding Beautiful World was conducted with the lectures with the format of asking questions such as 'Who am I?' and 'Where am I?' etc. In addition, I had

the opportunity to continuously ponder over the questions since training is conducted in silence. I remember the moment of meditation while looking at the glow of the setting sun. The Seolgok Mt. in December was covered by snow and I was thinking about the answers to the question "What are you seeing?" Then, I confronted the scenery of the red glow of the setting sun between the snow-covered slopes of the mountains. While I was marveling at the beauty of the harmony between blue and red, I looked at the eastern sky, the opposite side of the setting sun. The eastern sky displayed sooty sky blue color, which induced me to think, "How come the colors of the sky on this side are not wonderful with sooty sky blue?' At that moment, the question that, "Ji Yeon, haven't you been seeing only one side of yourself until now?' entered my thought. I have been living my life with the question of 'Why am I like this?' by looking only at the injuries and pains I



suffered. Although there would be a beautiful side of me just like that glow of setting sun, I always considered that my life is not beautiful by looking only at one side of myself. While looking at the sky, I shed the tears of reflection and regrets for the days I have lived by abusing myself. In addition, it entered my thought that 'this sky is also preparing for the sparkling of the stars in the night sky' while looking at the sooty color of the eastern sky. It was not beautiful because I thought it was not beautiful and it appeared to be a beautiful color when I thought it was in preparation for the night sky.

Remembering the moments of my anger, I tried very hard to hear the voices deep inside myself. I tried to talk with my mind with my head tilted down at a corner in the small conference room on the 1st floor. It was then that I heard my heart saying, 'Why did you come only now... It was so hard until now.' I continually told myself I am sorry. 'I am sorry for having come only now, for having ignored you and I promise not to do the same anymore.'Throughout the training, I was told to listen to the internal voices, that from the heart. I was totally dumbfounded on who this can be done and even became suspi-

cious of whether there are internal voice as I had never experienced such. However, I was able to miraculously encounter the subconscious that I had been ignoring, suppressing and locked up deep in myself until now. There are words in the Bible to be thankful for everything.

While reading these words, I questioned how it is possible to be thankful for all that happens since there are so many things that make me angry and unfair happenings. Through the 1st stage of spiritual training, I was able to realize that there is no anger in the affairs themselves and that anger will spring out if I plant the attitude for anger and gratitude if I plant grateful attitude.

I frequently thought that I am a captive in a glass bottle. I viewed those approaching me with kindness with distorted and twisted views. The life of having lived by judging others with the assertion that I am right and others are wrong was lonely and solitary. After having participated in the Finding Beautiful World, I texted my apologies to friends with whom I maintained awkward relationship.

I told them that I saw everything distortedly even the hands of friendship they extended out by being





a captive in my own little world and sought their forgiveness. Although I cannot deny that I was somewhat concerned for the possibility of distortion of my sincerity by my friends while sending the text, I mustered courage with the Words, 'do not worry about anything but pray to God with the gratitude for having saved you in all your affairs.' Fortunately, my friends believed my sincerity and replied with messages that they are the one who are sorry. I gave deep bows to my parents and told them that I am thankful for having raised me thus far, I am sorry for all the wrong doing that pained their heart and that I loved them. My parents embraced me tightly and told me that 'there is nothing you have done wrong', which cause me to shed tears. As I was washing the feet of my parents and younger sibling, I said 'thank you and I love you'. It was a moment of experiencing reconciliation and concordance.

I was able to break out of the captivity within my thoughts of being lonely and solitary, and came to recognize that there are many people around me. I realized that those who I thought disliked me were in fact not the case. Although I previously considered myself as a being squatting in the corner of a dark room, I was able to muster the courage to get up and come out of the room by opening the door of that dark room through the spiritual training in the Seolsok Mt. Truly, I have only to be thankful for the grace of God!

As I am writing my thoughts on my participation in the Finding Beautiful World, the memories of the training for spiritual life surface up. I long for the sounds of gong that replaced the clock, the sky with the glow of the setting sun and the Seokgok Mt. in December I experienced over a period of 4 nights and 5 days. I have been strongly recommending those around me to participate in the 1st stage spiritual training thereafter, to make time to participate in the training because there definitely is something in the Seolgok Mt.

'Nepum' Sunchon National University Volunteer Group embraced Nepal

Many people from all corners of the world visit Nepal to view Himalaya, referred to as the roof of the world. However, there are those who visit Nepal to serve the less fortunate neighbors rather than to have a view of the Himalaya. 22 students and teach staffs of Suncheon National University formed a volunteer team called 'Nepum' and visited the ghettos of Nepal to embrace and serve with love from January 12 to 23.

Dissipating the doubts such as "what can students who lived sheltered lives do?" completely, I was truly surprised at the tough and relentless attitude of pursuing and completing even the arduous and unpleasant tasks so well. What was more surprising is that they underwent more than 1 month of voluntary service training

by visiting youth center in Korea before their departure to Nepal.

Environment-friendly riverbank

The Nepum team of the Suncheon National University began to reconstruct the riverbank that collapsed first. All the teaching staffs including the professor, male and female students willingly walked into the dirty river with foul odor to construct dam by erecting the support beam with thick bamboo trees and crisscrossing long and thinner timber horizontally and vertically. Then, sacks filled with soil were put into this framework to firmly supplement and reinforce the collapsed riverbank. As they managed to reconstruct the riverbank so sturdily and wonderfully, the environment-friendly riverbank appeared to be a work of art. As soon as the Nepum team members began to work, the young children who were studying at the Hope School provided assistance by holding the sacks with their tender hands to make filling in the sack with soil easier and carrying the sacks with the Nepum team, thereby displaying a perfect unity. Although the task was rough and arduous, the students were very proud of the artistic and environment-friendly riverbank that they managed to build with their hands and sweat.

gratitude. All those at the gathering could not let go of the hands of others they were holding easily due to the enormity of the depth of the time in which everyone became one through love.

Come to Nepal!

Voluntary service is a highly valuable experience that is incomparable to anything else. Sharing that leads to unification through love is a memory that can induce renewed emotional fulfillment in life by reminiscing them throughout one's life. Above all things, is it not grateful that we can acquire the opportunity for experiencing of becoming neighbors by visiting and becoming unified by sharing and serving with love! Is this opportunity limited only to the students and teaching staffs of Suncheon National University? Come and try if you have the youthfulness of taking up the challenge regardless of the age! Come to Nepal where you can share such joy and gratitude anytime and with anyone!

Hope Class, the first beautiful fruit

Hope Class took its first step by holding the worship service for the opening with the Vision Trip Session 4 Team and Pastor Ildo Cho on August 1, 2014. They have studied very hard and the first fruits of such efforts are finally yielded. Among the children who never had the change to go to school or stop their schooling due to the poor financial situation or lack of the volition of the parents, 12 passed the elementary school qualification test of the government and are now able to pursue studies that they have longed for. The Tanzanian government offers free elementary school education to all the children.

Although the enrollment rate into the elementary school is 97%, which is very high in comparison to other African countries, the children in reality are not able to continue to receive education. Accordingly, the government has established the 'MEMKWA' program. Children who are old but failed to be enrolled into school and those who stopped schooling in the middle are collected separately for the 'MEMKWA' Classes for education in accordance with the academic level of these children. After a prescribed period of time, the children in the MEMKWA Classes are allocated into the grades in formal schools in accordance with the progress they have made. Majority of the children in the Hope Class are also receiving education by joining the 'MEMKWA' Classes. Children who were successful in gaining enrollment into the Hope Class are so happy and delighted with huge smiles on their faces. All the children changed into the neat and smart looking school uniform and were reborn as wonderful looking students.

In particular, 15-year old Peter, the oldest brother in

'Until the dream is realized'

There is a person who is currently living a new life by succeeding in rehabilitation at the group home for the blind after having lived for more than 1 year and 6 months at the 'Dail Little Heaven' although he has the disability of blindness. While undergoing treatment after having been diagnosed with 'diabetic retinopathy' 7 years ago, he was declared as disabled person with '1st level visual impairment' 3 years ago. He completely lost eyesight in both eyes as complication arising from diabetes and could not perform any daily life activities without the assistance of others. He/she attempted suicide several times as he lost the meaning of life as sense of guilt, lethargy and depression that suddenly manifested all at the same time. However, Byung * Kim who had the dream of becoming a trumpet player was able to regain laughter in his life because of his only hope, music. Although he has lost his eyesight, he frequently played his trumpet at the backyard of the 'Seoul Dail Church' throughout his stay at the Dail Little Heaven because he did not want to lose his dream. Byung * Kim who moved his residence to the welfare center for visually disabled persons was able to receive education and learn skills as a masseur. He is actively pursuing his work as he was employed as a masseur and continuing his efforts of realizing his dream by ceaselessly giving performances as a trumpet player. Byung * Kim stated that, "when I seriously considered suicide as I had fallen do far due to the immense difficulties





of life, it was 'Dail Little Heaven' that played the role of stepping stone that enabled me to live again with hope."

Cheers for Smile Grandma!

Smile Grandma who will now be living her life as a respectable citizen of Korea! Tears continuously flow out with smile on the face of Jong * Lee (Smile Grandma) who will finally receive in the middle of March her resident registration card for the first time in her 75 years of life. Because she could not even remember her name, Pastor Ildo Choi of Babfor gave the name of 'Yeon Seon' as well as his last name of Choi to the Smile Grandma through the resolution of the members of Babfor. Accordingly, she was once referred to as 'Yeon Seon Choi' by those around her. Now, she fortunately remembered, although vaguely, that her name is 'Jong *'.

Throughout the 11 years she visited Babfor thus far, she always had warm smile on her face that no one knew of her heart-aching past. Although she was hit by a large truck and transferred to a hospital, she could not receive proper treatment because she had no identification. Instead, she was only given an emergency treatment by the police. However, the life of the Smile Grandma began again from May 2013. The Dail Little Heaven, in order to assist the Smile Grandma who lived her 75 years of life by grasping the situations in her surrounding without being able to fully express her opinions due to substantially deteriorated level of cognition, provided support to find her resident registration by visiting numerous hospitals and government offices over a period of 1 year and 6 months.

The final judgment by the Seoul North District Court on the permanent domicile and facts of the birth of the Smile Grandma was made on January 26.
