to support the family, Dail Community started 1:1 child sponsorship in 2009. And children's life began to change with the 30,000 won (\$30) monthly sponsorship. Instead of begging in the street or looking for work, the children can now study at school, and their dreams, which used to be the same – becoming a doctor or soldier – because of their limited exposure to the outside world, became much more diverse like pilot, designer, and NGO workers. These changes were all brought by your love.

Until the day these children, the hope and leaders of our future, grow and become independent, Dail Community will continue to make effort so that more children can experience beautiful world together and fill their heart with dreams and hopes.

The Child I Met

*What are the criteria for selecting a child?

If you are already in or have considered 1:1 child sponsorship, you might have wondered how we select children for 1:1 sponsorship.

The children selected for 1:1 sponsorship are those who can be continuously managed by the overseas branch of Dail Community, and those who come from an underprivileged

school because of the family's financial difficulty, and children who suffer from a disease or malnutrition.

Connecting the children with sponsorship members helps restore basic protection and rights of humans and ensure healthy and happy growth.

Children's Life Changing with a Little Attention and Love

Your warm heart and touch through the 1:1 sponsorship provides children with free meals from Babfor and Bbangfor, as well as free rice,

cooking oil, and food for their home. Also, the children receive school uniform, bag, and stationery so that they can go to school.

Education is the most important factor for helping children overcome poverty and grow as leaders of the next generation. Dail Community runs kindergartens and Hope School (alternative school) to improve quality and higher education rate.

Continuing the Special Meeting

Members who apply for 1:1 child sponsorship receive the introduction letter and photos of

their sponsored child in two weeks. At the end of a year, a child development report is sent so that members can see how the child has grown over the year, and members who began sponsorship in less than a year will receive a Christmas card including a hand-written letter or drawing from the child. You can deepen your relationship with the sponsored child in different ways. If you approach them without hesitation, you can not only understand their life better but you can also give strength to them with your attention.

Here, we will introduce how you can make your relationship with the children more special.

First, Send a Letter

After joining the sponsorship, you can send a letter to the child via post or email. Write it in Korean or English and either mail it to Dail Foundation or submit it on the website, so that we can send it to the relevant overseas branch and the Dail Foundation staff or volunteer worker will translate the letter in the local language. After translation, the letter is delivered by the sponsorship manager directly to the child, and the delivery can be delayed when the child is absent for a long time because they are visiting hometown, etc. Although the period varies, you can receive a reply from the child in about four to six months, after translation and delivery.

Second, Send a Gift

You can send a gift to the child through the gift

money system. When you send a gift directly to the foreign country, there are difficulties such as expensive delivery cost and complex customs, and also it can get lost or damaged during shipping. To prevent these problems, we offer the gift money system, through which we buy and delivery products that are necessary for the child or their family in the country. The gift money system allows the children to receive your gift more easily as well as faster. There are different types of gifts available, such as one for the child, like a bicycle, one for the family, such as rice, and one for the local community such as installing a well. After the gift is delivered to the child through the overseas branch, you will receive a thank-you note from the child or the family.

Third, Visit the Child


You can meet the child you are sponsoring through Dail Vision Trip. By visiting the overseas branch of Dail Community and the child's local community, you will be able to see and experience the living environment of the child. Also, you can personally visit the child on your own. If you apply for a visit two to three months in advance, we will contact the local branch and send you the email address and contact of the local manager. This precious meeting that began with your love and sharing will let you discover priceless, precious value in life, even if it is only for a short time.

Secret of Happiness, **Sharing**

Although we hear the word 'sharing' so often these days, it is hard to practice 'sharing.' People say it is a virtue not to bother other people while making sure me and my family are healthy and comfortable.

However, here is a man and a school that saves and lives to share.

We met with Giho Kang, director of Theos Middle and High School, who accompanied people in need with Dail Community for the last 27 years.



Q | Tell us about Theos Middle and High School

Theos Middle and High School is an alternative school. Currently, many problems have been found in the South Korean education system, which demands private education and students are still constrained by grades. Violence at school is another issue. Both verbal and physical violation has become a serious concern in the society. And many students have become addicted to smartphone games.

As a Christian school, Theos Middle and High School was founded to provide a solution to these issues. However, that does not mean we indulge our students. In the enormous group of the youth, our school is an intersection that is armed with the Christian world view so that the children can enter the world. Instead of ranking students based on the grade or scores, we strive to help students discover their talent.

Our mission is to education students so that they love God and worship the world.

Q | We hear you began your donation to Dail on your own. What was your motivation?

I began to donate to Dail since I was in the graduate school, so it was probably more than 25 years ago. When I was a college student, I used to send 10,000 won (\$10) to Kkottongnae which was founded by the priest Wungjin Oh, and it was a fairly large amount of money for me at that time, since I made 100,000 (\$100) to 200,000 won (\$200) per month by doing a part-time job at that time. However, as Jesus said, I wanted to live a life in which I give even a cup of cold water to one of these little ones who is his disciple." I thought I would have another excuse if I decide to begin donating after graduating university and beginning to make regular income. So I decided to start 'small things, now' and have continued so far.

Q | Volunteer work must be difficult given the economic recession. What made you able to continue your service?

I don't know. I don't think you share because you are rich. I believe it is important to decide some principles to give. When I make income, I donate 1/10 of it to God, 8/10 to my wife, and 1/10 to others. After working hard for a year and if I have anything left, even if it is a little, I use it all to help others and begin a new year. My purpose is not to save but to give, because I always think of Jesus. He walked the rough road of Galilee without any place to sleep, but he still helped and took care of many people. My motivation is that I want to follow him, even in a small part of my life.

Q | What is your goal?

I want to live a life that helps others live. I hope adolescents and other people who did not have hope find strength and solace from me. I hope to bring smile back to those people. That is my goal in life.

Q | What does sharing mean to you?

To me, sharing is to 'make people feel happy the way they could not when they used to eat alone.' It is not easy to save to share with others, when you share, you can feel happy the way you could not when you eat alone.

Sharing is a miracle. It brings reward and joy to you and miracle to someone else. God does not turn his back against those who share. To me, sharing is, in a way, experiencing the miracle of God.

Do you remember Rom Witda?

Do you remember Rom Witda, who was introduced in the special article in the May/June issue of Dail Community Newsletter, a boy who lives in Cambodia and has a heart disease? Born in 2010 with a congenital heart disease, Rom weighs only 6kg and has never eaten any food since he was born – he is still fed on powdered milk mixed with sugar. A hospital in Siem Reap, his hometown, refuses to treat him, saying there is no hope, but his family cannot afford to find another hospital and he just has to live day by day until he dies

A donation campaign to help him receive surgery in South Korea was conducted via Happy Bean, a donation site of Naver. Employees of Shinhan Bank, who heard of Rom through Happy Bean, donated 8 million won from Shinhan Family's 10,000 Won (\$10) Sharing, which was collected by 10,000 won (\$10) monthly donation from their salary. Thank you for the precious sharing and act of love.

CAMBODIA



Dail Community in Cambodia cooks rice for over 400 children everyday in Phnom Penh and Siem Reap. Babfor prepares more than 10 local dishes preferred by children and changes the menu every day. The meals

that are made with care have been feeding children in slums with the greeting "Akun Preya Yesu (Thank you Jesus)" for 10 years now.

In slums where most people live with only one meal per day, the meal from Babfor is the only food the children have the whole day. For that reason, the staff at Dail Community prepare food as if they are feeding their own family, and go to the market early in the morning to buy the freshest ingredients.

For children who walk barefoot for 30 minutes and more just to have food, those who put all their food into a plastic bag so that they can share with their family, and those who refuse to leave a grain on the plate, Daily Community in Cambodia make and share food every day.

For over 400 children to have a meal, it costs \$350 per day, and it is possible because of people who donate to Cambodia and its children with love. Dail hopes that these children who grow with our food will live a better life and realize their dream in the future.

In Cambodia, where people still suffer from poverty, we hope you will continue sending us your attention and support.

Cambodian children's **favorite dish** that can be easily made in Korea as well

Cha teu rotso & Bai sach chrouk

Stir-fried cucumber and pork & marinated grilled pork



Ingredients: Pork 200g, 5 mid-sized cucumbers, a little bit of spring onion, 10 garlic cloves, 5 bird's eyes chili, 5 sugar cubes, salt, pepper, oyster sauce, fresh water



Melt the sugar cubes in water. Slice the cucumbers diagonally add 2 spoons of salt and leave it for 10 minutes. Mince the garlic and chili.



Remove blood from the meat by immersing in cold water. Chop it in pieces and marinate it by adding sugar, garlic, 1 spoon of oyster sauce, and 2 spoons of pepper, and leave it in room temperature. (It's matured in room temperature because Babfor doesn't have a fridge).

* To be used in 4 and 5



Put oil on a pan and stir-fry garlic and chili with a spoon of oyster sauce. Wash the cucumber that has been marinated for 10 minutes, remove water, and then stir-fry with the prepared meat for 1 to 2 minutes. And then add 2 teaspoons of pepper to finish.



Put oil on a pan and fry the marinated meat. Cut it in pieces, and fry it on the heated pan.



Chop the spring onions and sprinkle it over the food.

Share Food First at Christmas Festival

After 10 years, Nepal finally became a nation with constitution. Although the country became a free republic with Hinduism as the state religion and the King as the head of the nation, 10 years ago, the royalists and Hindu extremists wanted to return Nepal to a Hinu county this time, but Nepal chose to be a free republic in the end. India, unhappy with the decision, pressurized Nepal with different measures and finally suspended all supplies to the country. After the great earthquake and landslide caused by flood, the road to China became blocked and Nepal is now in deeper trouble after the suspension from India.

Most cars have stopped on the road due to lack of fuel, and restaurants are closing because they have no gas. Now, water supply has become scarce and people are having difficulty finding water to drink or wash themselves. Most people say they are going through a bigger trouble than they did during the earthquake, but Nepalis say they could simply walk if there was no oil and continue to oppose India.

Although Hinduism is not recognized as a state religion in Nepal, the largest Hindu temple <Pashupatinath Temple> is located in Nepal and 87% of the population follow Hinduism.

They continue to believe in 330 million gods, and that the top caste, Brahmin are right below god. Nonetheless, Nepal Dail Community are preparing for the second Christmas Festival with the residents at the slum, after the first even last year. Despite the pain, fear, and sadness after the earthquake, we hope to share the peace of Jesus with the people.

We hope that you would, like Jesus, who was born in a manger and befriended tax collector and sinners, join our hope to share food and spirit of reconciliation and unity. Save money for a meal and give love through Christmas food in Nepal, and with the money to buy a cup of coffee, you can give a gift to Nepal so that many Nepalis would experience love of God.

Health Checkup of Students at Hope Class

Most residents at the slum of Kunduchi, where Tanzania Dail Community is based, make a living by breaking stones at a quarry, and, therefore, their health conditions are at risk all the time. The fine dus that is spread around the town every day cause respiratory disease and cold in many children. Added to that, malnutrition and poor environment makes them vulnerable to malaria as well.

Moreover, many local people are exposed to AIDS, which is a serious threat in Africa.

Therefore, Dail Hope Class emphasizes hygiene to children, by teaching them to wash their hands often and brush their teeth after lunch. Children who grow up in poverty-stricken areas do not know how to brush the teeth prop-



erly, because they simply clean them by taking a small branch from a tree. For that reason, Tanzanian children love to brush the teeth.

The staff at Tanzania provide health checkup to test tuberculosis, AIDS, and typhoid. Thankfully, none was found to have AIDS, and three children had typhoid and are now taking medicine.

Please send these children your support and attention so that they can grow healthy and continue to study.

After-School English Class

Mr. Jongho Lee, who is working as the Cooperation Director at US Dail Community, came as a cooperating missionary and began to teach English to students at the after-school English class. He selected to teach 22 students, and they are all very enthusiastic. However, unfortunately, Missionary Lee have finished his 6-month service and is returning to the US on December 12. We are praying to find a short-term missionary to continue teaching the children after Missionary Lee's departure. As the Korean saying goes, 'Just be like Chuseok,' the autumn is the season of abundance and even fills the heart of people. We would like to let you know the series of warm hands that touched Vietnam Dail Community.

The first is Lotteria, which is loved by everyone. For Chuseok, Lotteria donated vouchers, with which we bought hamburgers and chickens and visited an orphanage in Cu Chi, Agape Church in Binh Chanh, and Heunghwa Bin Babfor, to share the food with children and the eldery and spend a happy Chuseok together.

We are happy because we are together. We look forward to tomorrow because we are together.

While Korea has 'songpyeon', Vietnam has the moon cake, which is called Banh Trung Thu in Vietnamese, meaning 'a cake you eat in the middle of fall.' In Vietnam, the custom of Chuseok encourages people to share food and gifts with children. Aware of this local cus-

Just like the name 'moon cake,' we shared it with neighbors like moonlight during the Vietnamese Chuseok. We are happy to delivery the news of love to Korea and even to Africa.

Sharing Every Day by Choice

It is not only the food that has been shared in Vietnam, and now even medical sharing has reached residents of the forest protection area in Can Gio, where there is no sufficient medical supplies.

Most households in this area take care of trees, and 143 families live in a remote place that takes

about 20 minutes by boat. Due to the nature of forest protection areas, there are many difficulties the residents have to endure everyday, such as lack of basic water supply and sewage facilities and medical facilities. Residents in this area use rainwater or water supplied from the land. However, they do not have proper purification facility and, therefore, are susceptible to stomachache and other health issues.

Can We Bring Back the Old Days?

Born in Yaecheon, Gyeongsangbukdo, Korea, Mr. Ryu is almost 60. While raising a family like most people, three years ago, he had cerebral infarction, which left him paralyzed on the right side and verbally-impaired. Although different symptoms are found according to the lesion in the brain, cerebral infarction shows symptoms such as motor paralysis, dysesthesia, and aphasia, and Mr. Ryu cannot use his right arm and cannot speak or communicate. He ran away from home because he did not want to cause any burden on the family.

After roaming around for a while, he began to live on the street and eat at Dail Babfor Sharing Campaign Headquarters. His health conditions became worse and he had been treated at Dail Angel Hospital until he came to us in October 2014 and began to live here with the care of Dail staff. At the time when he came to us, his resident registration and, therefore, national health insurance, was canceled. However Dail little Heaven took care of the administrative procedure to recover his resident registration and national health insurance

While living on the street, he used to drink and smoke to forget about his loneliness and sadness. But now, with the help of Dail staff and his determination, he stopped drinking and smoking and became much healthier. "If only I could go back to the days before I became paralyzed." He used to regret in despair, but now

he is trying to recover his health by constantly moving his body and activating the brain cells. For this resident who show strong determination for rehabilitation, Dail little Heaven looked for a way to help him and found a special rehabilitation program run by Seoul Metropolitan Government, 'Laundry Helper,' which provides 380,000 KRW monthly salary, and now he is attending speech therapy and writing class once per week and also makes effort to speak again. For Mr. Ryu who needs urgent rehabilitation for his body that is gradually becoming paralyzed, Dail little Heaven applied for the July Happiness Stock Exchange organized by Community Chest of Love, and he is now receiving treatment from October.

As the patient has difficulty with moving, he was hospitalized at Brain Rehabilitation Convalescent Hospital to receive more specialized rehabilitation and cognitive and speech therapy for six months. Although it takes a long time until his body fully recovers, this treatment can prevent his conditions from becoming worse.







Heart-warming story of Dail community is about to begun

Dail Community was originated in 1988 from Babsang community for poor and isolated people such as the elderly with no one to rely on or homeless.
