Nepal is still in pain

1 year of earthquake restoration damage in Nepal

Approximately 9,000 killed, over 25,000 injured April 25th 2015 is a day of unforgettable tragedy for the people of Nepal

A look at the year after the earthquake in Nepal, seen from the eyes of the Dail Community that implemented 8 emergency relief activities immediately after it.

The earthquake in Nepal hit with a magnitude of 7.8 on April 25th of 2015. After the earthquake in Haiti, there was a forewarning that another earthquake would hit Nepal, and just as predicted, Nepal experienced a terrible tragedy. However, despite the forewarning, not enough countermeasures were established in preparation for the earthquake.

Over 9,000 people were killed and 25,000 people were seriously injured. Countless World Heritage Assets were lost, and nearly one million houses were destroyed. The aftermath of the earthquake left Nepal in devastation, but the people of Nepal did not stockpile basic necessities or cause any riots. Despite the irresponsible and delayed countermeasures of the government, the people of Nepal did not panic, they endured difficulties, and maintained order to help with the restoration work. After the major earthquake, over 500 aftershocks continued to hit Nepal. As the aftershock frequency decreased and preparations were being made for restoration, the rainy season began in Nepal.

As the rainy season was coming to an end, on September 20th, a new hope was blossoming in Nepal. Enactment of Nepal's constitutional law was announced after nearly 10 years of struggle. However, issues were raised concerning the constitutional law enactment and blockade measures from India began, which lasted for nearly 5 months. People considered the blockade measures more difficult than the sudden earthquake. The fundamental needs of the lives of the people of Nepal were at risk. Basic necessities including oil and gas were cut off, and this was immediately followed by

an electricity crisis. The people of Nepal were forced to survive through the coldest winter in 20 years. Many vehicles ran out of fuel and were stranded on the streets, and it was very common to see people riding on bus rooftops. Most people had no choice but to walk.

Earthquake damage restoration was merely a hope; there wasn't anything that the people could do except to make temporary shelters out of trees. 10 months have now passed since the aftershocks ceased to occur. Nepal appears to be problem free on the outside. However, the lives of the people that have been destroyed and threatened due to the earthquake and the blockade are like dry land waiting for the rain to come. It is very difficult for them to restore their lives on their own.

The continuous love and support that the world showed to Nepal after the earthquake needs to be sustained in order to rebuild houses, schools, church buildings, and orphanages to transform Nepal into a land of hope. A whole year has passed and new regulations have been introduced to make things more difficult. At the same time, the level of interest and sup-

port has significantly decreased.

The emergency relief activities implemented through the love of the world really touched my heart while I was serving in Nepal. The people of Nepal were bound by fear. Nevertheless, many people from numerous countries came, despite the aftershocks, to help with the restoration activities. Such fundamental restoration activities need to be sustained.

Nepal Dail Community implemented emergency relief activities immediately after the earthquake. Since then, we have been providing practical support, such as a Mobile Babfor food service, Emergency medical camps, Rice/ Canopy/mosquito net sharing, public restroom construction, disease prevention, hygiene education, feminine sanitary products, etc. Furthermore, Nepal Dail Community will be reconstructing destroyed church buildings, as well as an orphanage to support families and children who have suffered tragic losses. By giving our best effort to restore the earthquake damages, we hope to raise Nepal as the "roof of the world" and gather the nations at Eve's resting place - (Mt. Everest).

Hygiene Education

Preparation period filled with excitement

I had just under a month to prepare. All NEON team members were busy preparing for the trip to Nepal even before the summer break began. I still have very fond memories of the day when we all met together for the first time. It was very awkward at first, but we've gotten so close now that it makes me smile just by thinking about it. We shared a lot of laughter and tears while preparing for the MT and education services, etc., with the team members. As I look back now, it was a very memorable time. I wasn't able to help out a lot with the preparations because I was scheduled for my practical nursing period. But the team members encouraged me and understood the situation. I tried to help to the best of my abilities.

At last, Nepal

After completing all the last minute preparations on January 3rd, I got on an early morning bus to head to the airport. Even as I was sitting in the plane heading to Nepal, it all felt like a dream. At the same time, I was overwhelmed with mixed emotions. After a long flight, I arrived in Nepal around 11 at night. My first impression of Nepal was very dark, and everyone looked at us as we walked by. It was then that I actually realized that I was in Nepal. All my expectations and excitement concerning Nepal dissipated and I was filled with concerns and fear. When we arrived at our lodging, the people seemed very unfamiliar. I don't know if it was because of fear or excitement, but I had a hard time trying to fall asleep.

Until No One Starves in this Land

Our team members had a responsibility to fulfill every morning while serving at the Nepal Dail Community. It was the 'Babfor' service: providing a hot meal to the children. Director Hong Choi of Nepal Dail Community said that the Babfor service is an activity that Dail does every morning with a resolution to put an end to starvation in Nepal. For children living in poor villages, this meal could be the first and last meal of the day. This is why it was very important for us to be punctual and fully responsible. Every morning, when we arrived at the center, the children greeted us by singing a song called 'Welcome'. We've learned so much from the children just by serving them. The importance of keeping promises, or of a meal, or of the water that we take for granted. We began to learn valuable lessons from the children

even before we gave them anything.

Life in Poor Villages

Nepal Dail Community is a center that ministers mostly to the children living in poor villages. On the first day, we were given the opportunity to look around the villages. I had imagined what the poor villages would look like in Nepal, but the living environment was far more difficult than what I had expected. Extremely limited living space, a canopy to call a roof, people living next to a pigsty... Such conditions were unimaginable for me. I really felt sorry for them. I heard a story about a little child who inched closer to the fire to keep warm in the cold winter. The child eventually burned to death. I was filled with an unexplainable emotion when I heard the story. I saw children who are exposed to various diseases and felt a greater need for hygiene education. It also allowed me to treat all the children with love and without prejudice.

Hope School Children

The main program that our team members focused on during preparation was education. We had many debates about whether to have

each member take a class or have the entire team take care of all the children. After we decided to divide the children into classes, we spent most of our time on preparing for educational programs. There were many unexpected variables when we arrived in Nepal, and we had to quickly modify the programs or discard some entirely. However, the team worked well together to overcome the obstacles. Most importantly, the children seemed to have a great time, which indicates that the Olympic and cultural performance programs were a success. I think I was happier than the children. At first, I was worried because I didn't like children in general. I didn't think I could get along with them, or even like them. However, the children proved my thoughts wrong. It was difficult not to love these children who had such pure and innocent smiles. Once, a child approached me and tried to warm up my hands.

All I did was spend some time with him, but I think he showed me a much greater love in return. I was very touched by what he did. I was a different person on the last day compared to the first day.

The children were crying as we were leaving because they didn't want us to go. A part of me didn't want to go back to Korea. However, just as my experience in Nepal became an unforgettable memory, I was confident that our visit to the children in Nepal also became a valuable memory for them.

On the third day of Himalaya trekking, we began walking at five in the morning to see the sunrise. It was the most difficult and the most memorable day at the same time. Five in the morning. Everything was pitch black, and we hiked on while trying to keep ourselves warm. We had to walk faster than other days because we had to see the sunrise. It was very hard. While taking a short break, I looked at the sky filled with countless stars. It was so beautiful and I couldn't keep my eyes off of the scenery.

Tonle Sap has gotten smaller

'Tonle Sap' is the name of a body of water in Cambodia which means 'Great Lake'. Tonle Sap is located in the central region of Cambodia. It is the largest lake in Asia with a latitudinal length of 300km.

However, the size of this large lake has decreased significantly. In the past, numerous tributaries led to Tonle Sap, but the tributaries have dried up so much that the riverbeds are revealed, the lake surroundings have dried up, and the external diameter of the lake has decreased.

In 2011, I was dispatched to Siem Reap for the first time, where the origin of the Cambodia Dail Community is located. During that time, I was informed that a tremendous amount of precipitation fell in the Mekong River region. As a result, the river failed to flow past Vietnam to the southern sea. The overflow of water flowed backwards to the Tonle Sap lake in Cambodia and caused a flood. Downtown Siem Reap, which is located on the northern part of Tonle Sap, was immersed in water during that time.

The city streets were filled with water and there were people traveling by boats. Vehicles couldn't be started because the water covered the hoods, and children caught fish and crabs in the front yards of their home. The Cambodia Dail Community Center was also located along the Siem Reap river leading to Tonle Sap, and our staff couldn't get to work because the lake overflowed. During that time, houses in the low altitude regions were completely immersed in water. Many people were victimized. Cambodia Dail Community provided emergency relief aid support in the Cheong Khneas region. In October of 2015, I was sent to the Cambodia Dail Community once again. It was the monsoon season in Cambodia at the time and I was expecting to see a lot of rain and water. But it was completely different from what I had imagined. It is common to see rain everyday during monsoon season in Cambodia, but it hardly rained. The cancellation of Cambodia's

water festival, which is one of the country's largest national festivals, was announced on the news. The festival couldn't proceed because the Mekong River's water level was too low. Now, it is difficult to travel to Tonle Sap on large ships or boats. In some cases, commuters are required to travel closer to the lake in order to enter it by boat rather than board a boat on a Tonle Sap tributary.

The pain caused due to the decreasing amount of water in Cambodia and the decreasing size of Tonle Sap delivered a direct impact to the families residing in the lake's surroundings. In Cambodia, water is a symbol of wealth and abundance. Poor families directly suffer from the effects of water shortage. In contrast, an abundance of water attracts the fish population to the Mekong River and Tonle Sap and increases the haul. Also, organic and floating matter in the water provides nutrients to the farmlands in the Tonle Sap region, which leads to an abundant rice yield. Such effects of the abundance of water lead to increased income for the residents. The residents of Tonle Sap region are still waiting for water because water means life and abundance for them. The effects of global warming and sudden climate changes inflicted on Tonle Sap were immediately followed by major difficulties for the poor people in the nearby regions. We ask for your support and prayers for the people living in the regions near the Cambodia Dail Community so that they will be able to overcome these difficult times. Dall







Dail Community established its Cambodia branch in 2004 and is actively involved in various projects to provide necessities for the local residents, such as food (Mealfor, Breadfor), 1:1 child sponsorship (Pumdail), education (Dreamfor), medical services, local development, income enhancement projects (Log boat support project), etc. One of the local development projects is the well digging ministry, which was recently covered by PD Notes on TV. If a viewer who saw the film had never

been to Cambodia, they could easily think that all NGOs active there are irresponsible and immoral. I think that it was very wrong of them to create such a biased documentary.

Water is life. Digging a well and providing water requires the heart of a servant, upright faith, and a moral lifestyle. Also, since water is life just as Jesus is life, the staff members at the Cambodia Dail community prepare with prayer and meticulous inspections (i.e. arsenic and water quality contamination test, validity test) prior to digging the actual well. If a resident of the ministry region requests for a well in the village, Dail community provides a well according to well-digging guidelines. Next, guidelines and training are provided for the residents so that they can take care of the well on their own. We keep post management in mind when we begin to dig wells for the residents. Serious health

complications and intoxications leading from arsenic contamination mentioned in the documentary film were a result of an arsenic stratum in Phnom Pehn, the capital of Cambodia.

Results of various tests conducted in Siem Reap, which is the primary region where Cambodia Dail Community is most active, did not show signs of arsenic in the well water, as you can see in the images above. A minimal amount was detected, but the level was less than the 10ppb WHO standard, which meant that it was safe to drink. Nevertheless, Dail Community did not proceed with well digging in the Phnom Pehn region due to risk of arsenic contamination.

The Cambodia Dail community recognized the dangers of poorly managed well-digging min-

istries 3 years ago. For this reason, Dail community joined hands with 'Borderless Conference of Scientists and Engineers' led by the titration technique research team of Seoul National University, with an objective to come up with a means to provide clean filtered drinking water other than well-digging. As a part of the effort, Siem Reap Babfor Center uses the water purification system developed by the 'Borderless Conference of Scientists and Engineers' every day to provide clean and safe drinking water to over 500 children and local residents. Director Hyung Gil Kim of the Cambodia Dail Community also drinks the same water with the residents every day.

When I think about the time when the Cambodia Dail Community was established 12 years ago, I remember seeing kids who washed their

white school uniforms in dirty water, children suffering from dermatitis and diarrhea due to contaminated water, and many people who came to Dail Angel Clinic to seek treatment for stomach pains.

After the Cambodia Dail Community provided mealfor, Bbangfor, and Waterfor services to the village, the children came to school with bright white uniforms, skin diseases were healed, stomach pains and diarrhea symptoms ceased. It was a wonderful time.

We learned that improving the wells alone cannot provide a perfect solution. Also, all regions were already over saturated with wells. As a result, Dail transitioned its focus from well digging projects to water purification and management projects. Furthermore, we are shifting our focus to providing practical necessities for the residents, such as through the Dail Clinic and boat support project. We now provide perfectly clean and safe water for the residents - as much as they need.

Hana Tour in Korea began recommending Cambodia Dail Community as one of the top 10 places to visit in Cambodia. Since then, many other travel agencies began to do the same. Dail Community has now grown to become one of Korea's most respected NGOs.

Dail Little Heaven is a homeless shelter (Resting Place) managed and operated by Dail Community under Seoul City's consignment. The most neglected and lonely people in the country are welcomed to this place to spend the last days of their lives in comfort without having to end their lives on the streets.

There are 35 residents currently living at Dail Little Heaven. Over 80% of the residents are suffering from severe illnesses, including cancer. The residents at Dail Little Heaven are terminally ill. However, many of their lives have drastically changed since they came to Dail Little Heaven. Also, there were residents who came in sick, but have since been discharged as healthy individuals. Most residents at Dail Little Heaven are regaining confidence in their lives through provision of consistent care, consultation and rehabilitation activities with our staff members. We would like to introduce Mr. Hyu Sik Kim, a resident at Dail Little Heaven with a terminal illness, yet with an eternal hope.

A Life thought to be over, a story with a twist

Last stages of nasal cavity cancer. Mr. Hyu Sik Kim is living with a terminal illness.

"Ring~ Ring~" March 6th, 2014... The telephone rang at Dail Little Heaven. The call was from Seoul Station's Dashiseogi Counseling office, inquiring about a vacancy. When we first met Mr. Hyu Sik Kim, his health condition was in a very serious state. He was diagnosed with nasal cavity cancer in 2012. The cancer cells spread from the temporomandibular joint to the cerebrum, which caused him to lose sight in his left eye. Recurring accidents also damaged his right eye as well. He ultimately lost both of his eyes. He had already received a 'life sentence' due to cancer metastasis. The doctors told him that he had 2 months at most to live. We decided to admit Mr. Hyu Sik Kim to Dail Little Heaven to provide some comfort for him.

He had difficulty finding the restroom on his own since he had lost both of his eyes. However, he showed a strong will to do what he could on his own. He waved his hands hundreds of times to become familiar with the surroundings, and now, he is capable of navigating himself through the Little Heaven facilities with ease.

In order to enhance the quality of life and psychological stability of Mr. Hyu Sik Kim, we conducted 2~4 counseling sessions every week. Through the counseling sessions, Mr. Hyu Sik Kim understood that death is a natural event experienced by all human beings, and he was relieved of the psychological, spiritual, and social fears concerning death. Also, he accepted Jesus Christ as his Lord and Savior through counseling sessions. He wanted to receive baptism, and Pastor Ildo Choi baptized him on February 13th of 2015. After being baptized, he said, "I didn't know getting baptized would make me this happy" and, "It feels like I am born again." He began a life of prayer after being baptized, and his life changed drastically since then.

His prayers must have reached the heavens as he was contacted by his one and only brother. Although they can't spend time together every day, whenever he visits, he brings well-prepared food to comfort Hyu Sik Kim. Finding his brother was a significant event in Mr. Hyu Sik Kim's life, and we could often find him counting the days until his brother comes to visit.

Mr. Hyu Sik Kim didn't have any hope before coming to Dail Little Heaven. But now, he is a completely different person. He had received his '2 month life sentence' on March 6th of 2014. However, he is no longer living a life in fear of death. He has been completely transformed. He was born again after coming to Dail Little Heaven, he is praying everyday as a devout Christian, and whenever he gets a chance, he makes jokes and laughs with the staff at Dail Little Heaven. He is having the happiest time of his life.

Nepal Blockade lifted after 5 months

The blockade that began on September 20th of 2015 was lifted at last on February 9th. So many things were lost due to the earthquake and the people couldn't do anything during the rainy season. They tried to begin restoration work after the rainy season, but India established a blockade, which cut off all oil, gas, electricity, and fundamental supplies. Furthermore, Nepal experienced one of the coldest winters in 20 years. People of Nepal were faced with a very difficult winter season, but I am very grateful that the blockade is finally lifted.

However, the cost increase that gradually built up over the past 5 months is slow to decrease, and the people of Nepal are still faced with many difficulties to start fresh. Nevertheless, many people are making an effort for the restoration of Nepal and to establish a better world to live. We ask for your continuous prayers.

New Beginning for Earthquake Damage Restoration

The earthquake in Nepal hit with a magnitude of 7.8, which was followed by two more major earthquakes and over 500 aftershocks. A 5.5 magnitude aftershock hit Nepal once again a few days ago, and everyone here had to hold their breath one more time. Despite the difficulties of the rainy season and the blockade that immediately followed the earthquake, people were busy trying to make restorations on personal levels. Now, since the blockade has been lifted, we are planning to focus on restoring and reconstructing the orphanage and church building in the Sindhupalchowk region, which suffered the most severe damages. Please pray for the restoration projects since the damaged conditions have worsened since the time of the earthquake. Also, please continue to provide your love and support.
