- Q1 It's been 20 years since you began as the honorary Dail Community. What motivated you to serve in the first place?
- Q2 It is very difficult to do one thing steadily. How have you been able to serve others for the past 20 years?

Q3 You are involved in multiple NGO services. What exactly do you do at Dail Community? With the children of Uganda Dail Community at the establishing service

I am currently an honorary ambassador for Dail, as well as for KMDF, World Vision, KOICA (Korea International Cooperation Agency). It was the love that I received from my fans that motivated me to take on such responsibilities. I try to always keep in mind that 'I am in debt to the world for all the love that I've received'. Because I received such great love as an actor, I decided to share and give in return for the love that I've received.

If serving others is simply giving or sharing something that is mine with others, I wouldn't have been able to do it for 20 years. During the time when I first began serving, people generally thought of serving as giving something to others. But after some time, I realized that I gain much more through giving. I experienced greater joy and a sense of reward in return for the service that I provided. There are many values in life, and the values that I experienced through serving were very worthwhile. I think that I was able to continue serving because of what I gained in return for serving others.

Currently, we are reaching out to children and making relationships through 1:1 child sponsorship programs and campaigns such as '10,000 Won Happiness' at Dail. I also visit Tanzania, Cambodia, and other overseas countries with established sponsorships to help them and provide services. In 2009, I visited the Dail community in Hunchun, China, to donate a library for the neglected people in the region. Furthermore, I am responsible for attending various events hosted by Dail Community such as 'Christmas Worship in the Streets,' 'Dail Community 7 Million Babfor Sharing Celebration,' 'Pum Dail,' etc. to introduce Dail Community's ministries. Q4 What was the most memorable moment that you've experienced while serving?

Q5 You've been involved in numerous services and activities for an extensive period of time. Have you ever experienced any difficulties? If so, how did you overcome them? I went on a trip to Ethiopia during the summer of 2011. Ethiopia fought in the 6.25 Korean War alongside our troops. I met the Ethiopian veterans who fought in the war, and I still vividly remember the horrible living conditions of their houses. The roofs and walls of the houses were nearly non-existent, and they didn't even have a proper washroom. Also, the drought in the region led to a serious lack of water, which makes the people vulnerable to various diseases and illnesses. But they still proudly wore the merits and medals that they received after the war, and it brought tears to my eyes. It was an honor to have been given the opportunity to serve the country and people who've risked their lives to save ours.

It would be a lie to say that I didn't experience any difficulties. Because I am a 'celebrity,' there are many cases where I am invited only to places and events where I am treated 'properly.'There are numerous other volunteers who work hard with all they have, and the fact that I get treated differently because I am a 'celebrity' really bothered me. But someone said this to me: 'It's not something that you can do anything about. Give your best in all circumstances that you find yourself in at all times. If someone needs your help, and you're able to help, take the opportunity to serve. What's important is that you are willing and able to help and serve.' After hearing this, I was relieved of my concerns and contemplations.



Water and Sanitation

'Early summer heat is catching women off guard... What's your strategy to get in shape for summer?"Healthy and Lean Body Project for the Summer Season"Get fit and improve your skin tone for the summer, all in one place...' These are some examples of advertisements and newspaper articles as the summer season approaches. TV programs are flooded with images of healthy and fit people to promote various effective weight-loss methods. It seems as if all of the attention of people living in Korea is focused on 'how to look great for the summer.'

However, the hot summer heat is raising different concerns on the other side of the planet. Tanzania is located in the eastern part of the Dark Continent, Africa. Tanzania Dail community was established merely four years ago, but Dail has been busy with various sharing and giving ministries. Despite our efforts, water is drying up due to the heat, and the little water that remains is susceptible to bacterial growth. Poor sanitary conditions are causing many people to suffer from various diseases and illnesses.

Helpless against risk of waterborne epidemic due to poor sanitary conditions!

Only 24% of the Tanzanian population has access to clean water. Regardless of the fact that the recommended daily amount of drinking water is 2-4L, as much as 76% of the population do not have access to a clean source. As a result, many people are left helpless against the risk of waterborne epidemics, such as bacillary dysentery, typhoid fever, cholera, etc. According to the WHO, the number of cholera patients in Tanzania over a period of 3 months from August of 2015 was 9,871 persons, of which 150 died due to the illness. Most people have weak immune systems due to malnutrition, and they are vulnerable to rapid spread of waterborne epidemics due to the poor sanitary conditions. It is a very sad fact that the majority of the deaths occur in children under 5 years of age.

'Lack of awareness concerning cleanliness.' It is crucial to deal with the root of the problem...

The amount of germs that grow after 3 hours without washing your hands reaches 26,000!

Simply washing your hands can prevent 70% of illnesses. This is also true for unsanitary environments; keeping your hands clean can prevent 50-70% of waterborne epidemics. However, most people in developing countries are not generally aware of the importance of hygiene or cleanliness; they eat without washing their hands, rarely brush their teeth, and do not mind the swarms of flies around them.

Currently, many countries in the world are implementing various projects and businesses to provide water pumps, tanks, wells, and water purification systems in Africa. As a result, such projects and businesses will increase the number of people with access to clean water, and also allow them to be free from illnesses. However, there is something that must be provided on top of supplying safe and clean drinking water. It is more important to raise awareness of the importance of hygiene and cleanliness. It is the people's responsibility to use clean water, and also to maintain and manage the facilities. If we fail to raise the awareness of the importance of hygiene and cleanliness, it is difficult to anticipate significant change. Dail Community's Hygiene Improvement Project

Tanzania Dail Community is implementing health and hygiene education, such as 'hand washing before eating,"fingernail and toenail clipping,' 'cleaning the surrounding environment,' etc., in order to help the local residents develop a proper understanding of hygiene and sanitation. This education program began in 2012 when the Tanzania Dail Community was established. It's already been 4 years! There weren't any noticeable changes at first, but as a result of consistent education and training, the local residents are capable of washing their own hands before eating and clipping their fingernails and toenails.

Furthermore, we are engaging in various other activities for the local residents including provision of anthelminthic to treat parasitic infections, as well as provision of mosquito nets to prevent malaria. All of these projects are implemented as part of a project to help the citizens of Tanzania to become independent and also to improve their health and sanitation.

During the time of the Korean War, Korea received a great deal of support from many foreign countries. However, in just half a century, Korea has become a country that 'gives' support rather than 'receives' support. There is nothing wrong with looking great for the hot summer season, but why don't we take a moment to think about those people who are suffering what our people have suffered in the past? We hope that all of the people of our country can remember the valuable support that we've received in the past so that many more NGOs can sustain relief and support activities to share love and support for the people in developing countries.

Dail Community of Vietnam Vietnam Dail Vision Center Project



Vietnam is located on the eastern part of the Indochina Peninsula. It is proximal to China to the north, and Laos and Cambodia to the west. Vietnam's total surface area is approximately 1.5 times greater than the Korean Peninsula, and it is known as one of the major rice farming nations near the Red River to the north and the Mekong River to the south.

Since Northern Vietnam's communist regime occupied Saigon in 1975, Vietnam is currently unified as a socialistic republic nation. Vietnam has achieved consistent economical growth since 1986 through reformations and open-door policies. However, the rate of population migration from undeveloped farming regions to major cities has increased significantly, and as a result, the regional gap between the rich and the poor has also increased.


Pastor II Do Choi, the founder of Dail Community, established Dail Community of Vietnam in June of 2002 with an objective to protect and help the sick and the poor by donating the full amount of a prize that he was awarded from Allianz Life Insurance.

It first began by providing free meals at GiaDinh Hospital and Am Hospital in Ho Chi Minh City, which were appointed by the Vietnamese government. In August of 2010, Dail acquired an official NGO permit from the Vietnamese government. Since then, Dail has been providing free meals and daily supplies to orphans, widows, seniors living alone, visually impaired, and physically disabled in BinhHeungHwa village in the BinhThanh district.



Beneficiary Area

Dail Vision Center is scheduled for construction in Tan Huong village, District 7 of Ho Chi Minh City, Vietnam. The majority of the residents of this district make a living by selling lottery tickets or working as a day laborer. Most residents are socially neglected and live in poverty. They do not receive any social benefits. Many of them are either disabled, seniors who live alone, or children from broken families. Support for these residents is in urgent need.



Vision Center Construction Overview

Dail has been working together with the Red Cross in Vietnam. Red Cross donated a venue used for cultural events and conferences in Ho Chi Minh City, District 7. Plans are in the making to remodel the existing building to newly establish the Dail Vision Center, through which free meals (Babfor, Bbangfor) and educational programs (after school classes, baking classes) will be provided.

Dail Vision Center will be used as a place for providing safe and nutritious meals to the disabled, seniors who live alone, and children from broken families. Also, it will be used as an educational facility for children to develop their dreams. Furthermore, it will be used as a local community welfare center for the local residents.

The Treasures of Nepal Dail Community, Youth Volunteers

It's been almost 2 years since I came to Nepal. Although it was exhausting when I first came here, my heart desired to love this country and its people. I also promised to myself to 'not try to judge or teach anyone based on what I've seen and heard.' However, some time passed and I voluntarily decided to play the role of an antagonistic director because I thought, in the long run, it would be more beneficial to the people to help them gradually become independent rather than simply 'spoon-feeding' them everything that they need.

So, since then, I encouraged the children to read the Bible at the end of each day, and set aside a day during the week for the children to receive discipleship training in order to strengthen the competence of our staff members so that they can become leaders who are prepared for any situation or circumstance.

I wanted the children to discover their identities and their capabilities on their own through the living word of God. I also hoped for the children to believe 'I can do everything in Him who gives me strength,'just as the apostle Paul declared.



Thus, I am training youth volunteers to become disciples of Jesus Christ so that they can carry on the current ministries. Select youths who have completed the National Qualification Exam and who are advancing to grade 11 and 12 are assigned to internship training in the kitchen or classrooms to assist the staff members.

Furthermore, some of our youth who desire to pursue further education are sent to universities in Korea, and we also provide support for them to attend the Dail Community DTS program. The children are also fluent in Korean and English, and we anticipate that they will grow into competent workers who will contribute to creating a more beautiful world through sharing, serving, reconciliation, and harmony. I truly hope that all of our youth can devote themselves as servants in the world.

Currently, roughly 40 youth from Nepal Dail Community are volunteers for the 'Babfor' program; they help prepare the food, distribute it, and clean the dishes to serve the community. These children have taken their first step toward living a life of servanthood, and they are consistently trained through worship, praise, and body worship. Our precious youth at Nepal Dail Community advance into what is called a Plus 2 program, which can be considered a preliminary college program, after completing the grade-10 foundational education curriculum. However, the tuition is quite burdensome for children from low-income families, and we wish to provide scholarships for such children. Please pray for all of us at Nepal Dail Community so that our youth can develop and grow into pillars of Nepal in the future!

Beautiful Ministries at New Jersey Presbyterian Church and New York Moakyang Presbyterian Church

After last year's earthquake in Nepal, Pastor Ildo Choi began earthquake relief activities in Nepal. Then, he toured the eastern USA to raise support for Nepal. A year has passed since then, and we've successfully completed the 17th Dail Spiritual Training Camp. After the camp was over, we held a meeting with New Jersey Presbyterian Church (Sr. Pastor Do wan Kim) and New York Moakyang Presbyterian Church (Sr. Pastor Byung Ki Song) to present a report on the Nepal earthquake relief ministry activities.

New Jersey Presbyterian Church delivered over \$10,000 in relief funds, which were used to build an orphanage facility for 40 children in the Sindhupalchowk District, which suffered severe damage due to the earthquake. Moakyang Presbyterian Church also delivered over \$10,000 in relief funds, which were used to rebuild the Hosanna Church in Sindhupalchowk District. The funds were also used to restore other church facilities.

Pastor Byung Ki Song from Moakyang Presbyterian Church will be attending the Hosanna Church dedication ceremony in October. He is already raising funds to purchase gifts for the church members and local residents.

We would like to extend our sincere gratitude to the members of New Jersey Presbyterian Church and New York Moakyang Presbyterian Church for their contributions to enlarge the kingdom of God. **Dall**

For a better future for Ohmanuse Village

Cambodia Dail Community is currently implementing The Korean Red Cross Blood Donor Voucher project. This project is intended to support the improvement of the residential environment and to increase income for mine victims in the Ohmanuse village in Banteay Srei region, as well as for people who live in poor residential conditions.

Prior to commencing the project in detail, we visited 50 families to listen to their stories and their needs. There were some families that live in the regular homes commonly seen in Cambodia. However, most families lived in houses with poor walls, roofing, and flooring conditions. It was hard to believe that anyone could live in such conditions. The local Cambodian staff member who visited the families with us witnessed such living conditions for the first time and shed tears in sympathy.

In order to ensure efficient project implementation, we submitted a project plan to the Department of Social Welfare in Siem Reap. They

not only approved of the plan but also promised to give us full support.

The income increase project provides chickens to mine victims who are not able to work to sustain their lives, and who have been neglected by the local community due to their disabilities.

Before providing the chickens, we visited the families who would be receiving them and built chicken coops for them. One of the men looked at the chicken coop and was very happy, and he said that it was better than his own house. We were very glad that the recipients were happy. We felt love through sharing and giving on the day of delivering the chickens. The driver delivering the chickens was worried that the chickens might get sick or die during transport due to heat. He got up early in the morning to prepare to deliver the chickens. One recipient shared her hopes to raise more chickens and expressed her joy. People giving help and those who received help all experienced the joy of sharing and giving.

This is our prayer. We pray that people and chickens alike will not become weary in the hot summer heat or sudden torrential rain, and that everyone would be healthy and happy. Also, we pray that the families that received the chickens could feel and experience the love of God through our act of sharing. We sincerely pray that Jesus will reveal His love through our giving and sharing. **Dall**.

Rest in Peace, Hyu Sik Kim

Hyu Sik Kim was introduced to Dail Little Heaven on March 6th of 2014 through Dasiseogi Comprehensive Support Center at Seoul Station. His health status at the time was indescribably poor as he was diagnosed with nasal cavity cancer 2 years ago. The cancer cells spread from his mandibular joint to his brain, and as a result, he lost sight in his left eye. He had already lost sight in his right eye 20 years ago due to an accident. He was practically blind. He was given 2 months to live at the time of cancer diagnosis. He didn't have any hope left in his life, and only darkness was ahead of him. But Dail Little Heaven embraced Hyu Sik Kim to help him find a single ray of hope.

Through the help of the staff and employees at Dail Little Heaven, Hyu Sik Kim didn't give up on his life. The doctors gave him 2 months to live, but a year from the day he came to us, on March 6th 2015, he was baptised by Pastor Ildo Choi. Furthermore, his prayers must've been answered as he regained contact with his family that he'd lost touch with a long time ago. He was hopeless before he came to Dail Little Heaven, but he rediscovered the joy of life after coming to us. He was with us for roughly 26 months, and on May 8th 2016, God took him into His arms. Hyu Sik Kim's family members who had lost touch with him for a long time expressed their gratitude to Dail Little Heaven and decided to become a part of the Dail Angel Sponsorship program. Dail Little Heaven will continue to work to help lonely and neglected people to find comfort in the latter part of their lives without having to end their lives on the streets.

Union International School in Philippines




